Curriculum Overview of our Kindergarten

Religion: Faith and Life Series, Ignatius Press Program components include: Bible history, sacraments, traditional prayers, and the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Reading/Grammar/Writing: Pearson Literacy Program, letter formation, journaling Literature: Daily silent reading and daily read aloud, which encompasses a variety of age-appropriate literary genres Phonics: Scott Foresman

Science: Interactive Science

The Nature of Science, Problem Solving, Living and Non-living Things, Plants and Animals, Earth and Sky, Objects, Matter and Mixtures, and Motion

Mathematics: Saxon Math Program

Program components include: numeration/operation, measurement, computation, geometry, problem solving, data analysis, patterns and functions, fractions and decimals, and analytical skills.

History/Geography: Pearson Learning

Exploring our World, Native Americans, Map Skills, Exploring and Moving to America, Mount Rushmore Presidents

Spanish: Students learn Spanish through songs, games, literature, and cultural awareness activities (a natural acquisition approach). Program components include: listening, speaking, vocabulary development, and phonics.

Art: creativity in variety of media, fine motor control, and art appreciation.

Drama: breath awareness and breathing techniques, vocal quality and projection, movement on stage, how to build a character, communication, teamwork, creativity, confidence, memorization, and healthy emotional expression. **Music:** vocal music and theory, introduce various styles of music and different tempos and beats, learn religious, folk, and children's songs.

Physical Education: spatial awareness, gross motor skills, various team sports, and emphasis on good sportsmanship.
